Czechoslovakian Pottery Copies

As a Czech pottery collector one should be cautious especially when buying on the internet. In the past we were aware of the Japanese copies of our favorite animal pitchers including the Raven (often called the toucan) in a 5" size smaller than the Czech molds, the Elephant also in a smaller size, and lately the Dog, in the exact same size. This pottery is usually heavier than the Czech and the paint is much more prone to cracking and chipping and the pottery to crazing.

The English pottery copiers have been much more adept. The standard pitcher molds of LOSTRO, BIRMA, BATNA and latest find the "W" have all been copied.(photo1) Usually these copies had painting patterns much like the Czech but not a standard Czech painting pattern.

This past Summer I purchased a pitcher on the internet in a standard pitcher mold and a standard pitcher pattern (photo2) and when it arrived to my dismay it was not Czech. If I had seen the piece in person I would have known by the pottery weight and painting crispness that it was not Czech, but this is not possible with the internet. (photo3). We know from the literature of English pottery certain companies made these pieces specifically to compete with the less expensive Czech Pottery that was so popular in the 1920s and 1930s. 

The hotel is located about 40-45 minutes from Reagan National Airport. From there you can take the Metro subway to the Shady Grove Metro Station, where the hotel shuttle bus can pick you up.
